

# Lords consideration stage briefing on home early medical abortion provisions in the Health and Care Bill

5 April 2022

#### Introduction

Ahead of the Lords Consideration of Commons amendments to the Health and Care Bill on Tuesday 5 April 2022, this briefing outlines the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health's (RCPCH) position on home early medical abortion.
