



This diabetes clinic is taking part in an important national project about paediatric diabetes care and treatment in the NHS.

This project is called the National Paediatric Diabetes Audit (NPDA).

What is the NPDA?

The NPDA is a comprehensive, national-level initiative in England, Wales and Jersey aimed at evaluating and improving the care provided to children and young people with diabetes.

Taking part in the NPDA shows that this diabetes clinic is committed to improving care for children.

What data does the NPDA collect?

The NPDA collects a variety of data to assess and improve the quality of care for children and young people with diabetes. This includes demographic data such as age, gender, ethnicity, as well as clinical data such as the type of diabetes and the date of diagnosis.

What if I don't want my data to be included in the NPDA?

You can opt out by asking your paediatric diabetes team to not submit your data to the NPDA if you live in Jersey. [HSSClinical](#)
